NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNFICANT IMPACT AND NOTICE OF INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Everglades City.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about June 28th, 2024 the City of Everglades City will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Community Project Funding (CPF) grant funds under Public Law 117-103 of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022, to undertake a project known as the *Chokoloskee Master Pump Station project* for the purpose of design, permitting, and construction of improvements to replace or rehabilitate the existing Master Pump Station located adjacent to Smallwood Drive in Chokoloskee Island. The anticipated improvements would increase the capacity and durability of the wastewater transmission system in Chokoloskee, while supporting future septic to sewer conversions within the island.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Everglades City has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at https://cpd.hud.gov/cpd-public/environmental-reviews.

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ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Everglades City certifies to HUD that Mayor Howell Grimm Jr. in his capacity as Mayor of Everglades City consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Everglades City to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Everglades City's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Everglades City; (b) the City of Everglades City has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the Miami HUD administration office at Brickell Plaza Federal Building 909 SE First Avenue, Room 500, Miami FL, 33131-3028. Potential objectors should contact the CPD Director David Noguera via email CPDROFMIA@hud.gov to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
