

Important Information About Your Drinking Water

Everglades City Drinking Water System

SITUATION

Everglades City public drinking water system failed to perform monthly compliance monitoring for the bacteriological contaminants, during the month of March 2026 in accordance with Rule 62-550.514, Florida Administrative Code, and our current, Department approved, sampling plan.

HEALTH EFFECTS

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During March 2026, we did not perform monitoring for Bacteriological contaminants, and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water (with respect to these contaminants) during that time.

WHAT SHOULD CUSTOMERS DO?

Samples for these contaminants were collected in April of 2026, and the laboratory analyses results indicated that our water system was meeting drinking water standards therefore, **at this time, customers need not take any action or seek an alternate water supply.**

WHAT IS BEING DONE ?

Although our water system did not perform monitoring for Bacteriological Contaminants during March 2026, we did collect samples for these contaminants in February 2026 and April 2026; our water system will return to monthly monitoring in accordance with our Department approved sampling plan.
